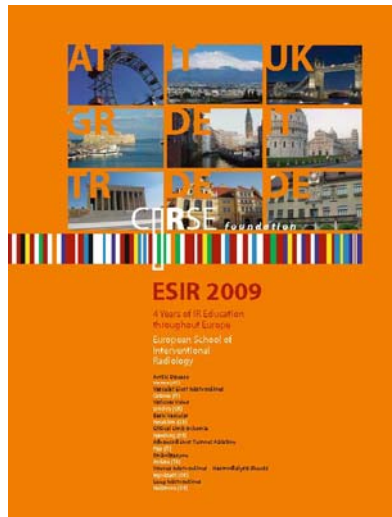

### ESIR Format

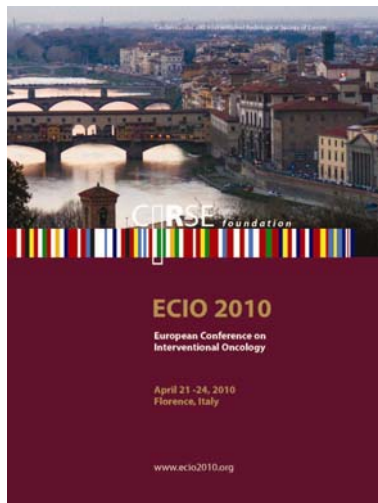
